



## FAMILY TRAVEL TO BE WITH ARTHUR AT MUD CORNER CEMETERY 100 YEARS AFTER HIS DEATH

#### lla Pellow

Arthur Henry Walker Service NO. 12306 2nd battalion Auckland regiment, NZEF Born 1893 in Selston Nottinghamshire England. Died 1st of August 1917 aged 23. He came to New Zealand with his parents in 1913.

Enlisted when he was 21. Selected for G company of the 3rd reinforcement of the 3rd Battalion. Embarked May 6th 1916, for Suez, Egypt.

Two of his brothers also served. Frederick Dean Walker service number 29518, and Joseph Moody Walker service number 29519, in the first battalion reinforcements NZEF.

Fred and Joe were very close brothers and best of friends. When Fred enlisted in the army on June 26 1916, so did his brother.

Joe was too young at the time (18 years) both lifted their age by a year so they could go and fight together. Fred and Joe were injured on 8th of June 1917 at Messines (sitting opposite each other and from the same bomb). Both were sent back to Hornchurch in England to heal with Fred being sent back to New Zealand in December and Joe returning to Belgium.

On 30th of July 2017 13 relations went to Ypres/leper Belgium to be with Arthur 100 years after his death. On 1st of August we travelled out to Mud Corner Cemetery (used from 7th June 1917 to December 1917). Buried are 85 soldiers. Identified as 52 New Zealanders, 31 Australians. Unidentified one New Zealander one from the UK. From Mud Corner Cemetery you can see two other cemeteries.

The previous day we had travelled to Warneton to the Dedication of the Memorial to the La Basse-Ville battle. In this little known battle which 1006 soldiers lost their lives. The battle was from 11th of June to 28th of August 1917. Most of the soldiers if not all were New Zealanders. This battle was part of the Third Battle of Ypres. The soldiers were sent to distract the Germans while the British Army attacked Passchendaele.
