PATRON - Alan 'Chips' Finney



Chips is a Life Member of Whangamata RSA and has been a member here for more than 20 years.

Over the years he has been very involved with the RSA and has assisted wherever possible.

ANZAC Days – always available to help, including setting up and taking down the hall, as well as rum rations.

ANZAC Day Sunrise Services – always available to help and he was the main instigator of the flag raising on the beach.

Poppy Days – always available to help and does several shifts throughout the day, including filling in for people that are unavailable.

He always makes an effort to help distribute and pick up the poppy boxes in the Club and shops.

Chips has been on the Executive Committee in the past and took a great interest in the RSA, always offering to help where he could.

Funerals – always available to help with setting up and putting the chairs away afterwards.

He was always a handyman of his choice, whether it be gardening, weed spraying, mowing lawns, arranging working bees to repair and paint fences, etc. I was born in Hunterville on a sheep station, Waka Farms. I was one of four children (three boys and one girl).

In 1950 we moved to Maraekakaho sheep station, Ngatarawa which was owned by Glazebrooks. I was in primary school at this time. Moved to Waipaua sheep station in Tetoki, in late 1952 moved to a sheep station in Koeke. My high school years were spent in Rangatau going to Ruapehu college.

I left school in 1955, I worked in the market gardens for Jan Megos and Sue Jo When I left there, I worked at a timber mill for Bennett and Punch and in the bush as a ropey.

In 1956 I worked on the railway steam locos at Tamanui. I was transferred to Auckland to work on the locos (didn't like Auckland much). I also received my firemen's ticket and worked for VW in Otahuhu while in Auckland. I left the railway and worked on a dairy farm in Waiuku for Joe Stoup.

I then went to Pa Farm, owned by Walter Strevens (dairy farm). I worked for Carter Merchants classing native timber. Andrew and Andrew truck driving, I left there after some time spent in hospital, then moved on to New Zealand glass (I left there because it was too noisy).

In 1958 I joined the Army.

I spent some time fencing and shearing. After this I became a power board trainee linesman finished up as linesman faultman, I was made redundant in 1995 after 30 years.

Worked for Ken Irwin: pre hung doors, Alan Spurdel: roof trusses and pre nail house frames, Joe McArthur: concrete laying, Ray Simpkin: tower hire (cherry pickers) and contract farm fencing and scrub cutting.

In 1967 I got married and we had three kids, we were married for 21 years. I moved to Whangamata in 1995, I was also looking after my brother's farm in Mangatauphiri at this time.

I joined the RSA prior to moving here in 1995, Doug Fieldhouse found out that I had been in the army and asked me to join so that we could have three more associate members join. During my time in Whangamata I have also helped at Whangamata Motor Camp with the grounds etc.

I have played Indoor Bowls, Snooker, Golden Oldies Snooker (which I still help to run).

On the sporting side of things, I was involved in starting the Weymouth Rowing Club, in 1972 I started the Weymouth Rugby Football Club with Eric Seranck and Ray Hagan. I helped with Waipu Surf Lifesaving Club and Whangamata Surf Lifesaving Club. I represented in High School cricket and swimming, and coached swimming for the surf lifesaving club. I also played rugby and enjoyed rodeos as a young fella.

I have four grandchildren. I met Joce in 2006 and have been happy as Larry ever since.

I was born and raised in Whanganui. My Father was a pilot in the Pacific 1940 to 44. (TBF's and Corsairs). My Uncle, a bomber pilot, killed.

I started work on farms, attended Flock House and Massey University. (Cert Ag., Dip Dairy Farming). I spent two years as volunteer farm manager and sawmill manager on Presbyterian Mission Farm in Vanuatu. Three years training for Anglican ministry. (L.Th , Dip ministry).

I have held a private pilots licence. I served parishes in Taranaki, Bay of Plenty and Waikato, Archdeacon of Waikato.

At age of 50, commissioned Army Chaplain and served 4 years in Waiouru.

Served with NZ Batt 5 in East Timor. Promoted to Major(E) Transferred to RNZAF, posted to Woodbourne. (Squadron Leader). Promoted to Wing Commander, Principal Chaplain RNZAF. Responsible to the Chief of Airforce and working out of Joint Force HQ, responsible for NZDF deployments.

DEAD MAN'S PENNY

Terry Brown has researched the history of the Veterans that we have Dead Man's Pennies for on display. Jim Pullingers has now been returned to his family.

6/1381 PRIVATE JAMES PULLINGER, CANTERBURY INFANTRY BATTALION

James Pullinger was born in Tinwald on 12 May 1878, the son of Robert and Charlotte Pullinger. His surname is spelt as both Pullinger and Pullenger on his documents, although his birth is registered as Pullinger. James was attested in Timaru on 6 October 1914 and entered Addington Camp on 20 October 1914, posted to the Canterbury Infantry Battalion (CIB). At the time of his attestation he was working as a Labourer for J.E. Lochland of St Andrew's.

It is difficult to personalize an account where a junior soldier is concerned. They seldom feature in the Unit History or the war diary. Thus it becomes necessary to follow the individual through the movements of his unit, until his file shows a transfer or posting elsewhere.

James appears to have been posted to 2nd (South Canterbury) Company within the CIB, and as such embarked in the troopship Athenic on at Lyttelton 2 October 1914. Following a delay in Wellington the convoy carrying the New Zealand troops left Wellington on 16 October and reached Egypt on 3 December by way of Albany, Colombo, and for the Athenic, Aden. The troop were to disembark in Egypt and complete their training before moving to France. In February 1915 the battalion was involved in the defence of the Suez Canal and the 2nd Company was deployed in the area of Ismailia. There was no direct action, but the company was subjected to intermittent artillery fire.

On 12 April 2nd Company embarked in the Lutzow, arriving at Mudros on 15 April. The company arrived at ANZAC Cove at 7 a.m. on 25 April and disembarked around midday. On 28 April James suffered a gunshot wound to the scalp and was evacuated to Alexandria. He remained in the hospital system until 15 May and a fortnight later he embarked to return to the Peninsula.

On 17 August James was admitted to the New Zealand Field Ambulance with Enteritis and the same day was embarked in a hospital ship bound for England. James was admitted to Devonport Military Hospital on arrival in England. On 9 September 1915 James died and was buried in the Corporation Cemetery, Devonport, now known as the Plymouth (Weston Mill) Cemetery.

For service with the Canterbury Infantry Battalion in Egypt and Gallipoli, James received the: 1914-15 Star, British War Medal 1914-19, and Victory Medal.

James also served with the 9th Contingent, New Zealand Mounted Rifles during the Second South African War and received the: Queen's South Africa Medal with clasps TRANSVAAL, and SOUTH AFRICA 02.



28631 PRIVATE ERNEST WILLIAM RHODES, 1ST NEW ZEALAND EXPEDITIONARY FORCE

Ernest William Rhodes was born in Coromandel on 17 September 1890 the son of Thomas William and Emily Rhodes (née Leaning). At the time of his attestation he was a public servant working as a Clerk in the Supreme Court, Wellington. He had also served as a territorial soldier with No 3 Company, Engineers in Auckland.

Thomas attested at Trentham on 27 June 1916 and entered camp the same day. He was posted to G Company of the 20th Reinforcements, destined for the New Zealand Rifle Brigade (NZRB), and on 31 August he was promoted to sergeant.

It is difficult to personalize an account where a junior soldier is concerned. They seldom feature in the Unit History or the war diary. Thus it becomes necessary to follow the individual through the movements of his unit, until his file shows a transfer or posting elsewhere.

He embarked in the troopship Athenic, which sailed from Wellington on 30 December 1916 and disembarked at Devonport on 3 March 1917. Ernest marched in to Sling Camp on the Salisbury Plain, was posted C Company of 5 Reserve Battalion, NZRB and reverted to temporary corporal on 3 March. On 31 March he reverted to private having failed a junior non-commissioned officers' course.

On 3 April 1917 Ernest moved from Sling to Codford Camp, also on Salisbury Plain, where the 4th NZ Infantry Brigade was forming. He was initially posted to 6 (Hauraki) Company, 3 Battalion, Auckland Infantry Regiment, but on the same day, 3 April, he moved to 11 (Taranaki) Company of 3 Battalion, Wellington Infantry Regiment (WIR). Ernest embarked for France on 27 May 1917, crossing the Channel in the S.S. Australind.

On 23 July, 3 Battalion was completing a spell in the trenches in the Le Touquet sector to the north-east of Armentières. At some point on that day Ernest was killed, he is buried in Motor Car Corner Cemetery south of Ypres, Belgium.

For his service with 3 Battalion, WIR in France, Ernest received the: British War Medal 1914-19, and Victory Medal.

12/2872 PRIVATE CECIL LOUIS WALKER, AUCKLAND INFANTRY BATTALION

Cecil Louis Walker was born in Mercury Bay on 1 October 1887 to Maxwell and Ellen Louise Walker. At the time of his attestation he was employed as an accountant by the Auckland Remu Timber Company, Newmarket. Cecil was attested at Trentham on 16 April 1915 and entered camp on the same day.

It is difficult to personalize an account where a junior soldier is concerned. They seldom feature in the Unit History or the war diary. Thus it becomes necessary to follow the individual through the movements of his unit, until his file shows a transfer or posting elsewhere.

Cecil embarked in the troopship Willochra as a member of A Company, 6th Reinforcements on 14 August 1915 and disembarked at Suez on 19 September 1915. Ten days later he joined the Auckland Infantry Battalion at Mudros posted to 16 (Waikato) Company. On 8 November the battalion returned to Gallipoli for the final six weeks.

On 29 December 1915 Cecil disembarked at Alexandria following the successful evacuation of the ANZAC forces on Gallipoli. It was now a period of training and reorganization. There were now sufficient reinforcements in Egypt to form a third infantry brigade and thus create a New Zealand division. By utilizing experienced officers and non-commissioned officers from the original four infantry battalions, regiments were created with a 1st and 2nd battalion each. Cecil remained where he was and was now a member of 1st Battalion, Auckland Infantry Regiment (AIR).

The battalion embarked in the troopship Franconia at Alexandra on 6 April 1916 bound for Marseilles. On arrival in France the New Zealanders boarded trains and moved to northern France. On 13 May the battalion went into the line at Armentières, recognized as a "quiet" sector where troops new to the Western Front could learn about trench warfare. The New Zealand division was to remain in the Armentières sector until mid-August when it moved to the Somme battlefields. Following a period of reorganization, rest, and training the Battalions moved into the line. On 15 September 1 AIR moved up to the area of Mametz Wood preparatory to an attack towards Flers. According to the War Diary 16 September was day of undergoing two artillery barrages, machine-gun fire, and snipers. At some point on the 16th Cecil was killed.

Cecil has no known grave and is commemorated on the New Zealand memorial in the Caterpillar Valley Cemetery, located to the east of Albert. For his service with the Auckland Infantry Regiment at Gallipoli and in France, Cecil received the: 1914-15 Star, British War Medal 1914-19, and Victory Medal.

Cecil's brother, 38462 Private Eric Trevor Logier Walker served with 2 Battalion, AIR and was killed in action on 30 March 1918. Eric is buried in the Euston Road Cemetery, Colincamps to the north of Albert. For his service with 2 Battalion, AIR, Eric received the: British War Medal 1914-19, and Victory Medal.
